Alternatively you can spend **\$33** on these three ebooks (twenty dollars, eight dollars and five dollars) and you will have high-quality instructional materials and the page numbers for each of the topics below. It is up to you. (Of course I am not on commission here!)

Of course you can work through Lightroom finding your own way. This is not efficient but it is exciting because sooner or later you will come across wonderful bits and think "**Wow I wish I had known about this years ago!**".
